SUMMER FOOD FOR THOUGHT

The Nevada CSD Administrative Team is always engaged in a book study and most recently finished, *Out of Our Minds: Learning to be Creative* by Sir Ken Robinson. Robinson notes, "the principal role of a creative leader is not to have all the ideas: it is to nurture a culture where everyone can have new ideas." This seemed an appropriate line to preface the information I'm excited to share with you regarding summer programming for the children of Nevada. Due to various partnerships and a great deal of collaboration (ideas by many!), Nevada Schools will host summer programming for children (ages 3-18) this summer.

Nevada Community School District is sponsoring "Food For Thought" from June 16 – July 31 at Central Elementary. Learning activities will begin at 9:30 a.m. and continue until 2:00 p.m., Monday–Thursday. Transportation, lunch and snack will be provided at no cost to participants. Sessions of reading instruction will be included for identified students currently in grades 2-3, with four to five students per certified teacher.

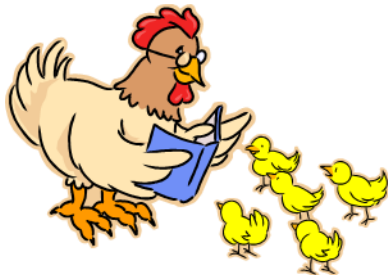

Nevada High School Commons

2nd Annual Iowa High School Renewable Energy Conference

Two hundred thirty nine students from eighteen high schools attended the second annual Iowa High School Renewable Energy Conference held at Nevada High School. Through collaboration with community and regional companies and resources, students were able to learn about career opportunities in a multitude of sessions and tours throughout the day on Wednesday, March 26th.

Off campus tours and sessions included DuPont's advanced biofuel utilizing crop stover, Couser Cattle Company feeding of co-products, Lincolnway Energy's ethanol production, and BECON Research facility. BECON is part of the Iowa Energy Center and is managed by Norm Olson PE. While students were out in the community, Gates Hall and the high school auditorium were busy with sessions on wind turbine technology provided by Iowa Lakes Community College's Dan Lutat. Lutat is the program director and is a leader in the US in preparation of wind turbine technicians. Solar FX of Ames Iowa inspired students on the current status of photovoltaic energy and opportunities. Back from last year was Eric Olson of Indian Hills Community College explaining bioprocessing of grains to produce a wide variety of products used domestically and the need for qualified technicians.

A college fair was also added to this year's conference, several students commented on the benefit of being able to visit with the colleges. "I really have to give credit to IHSREC chairperson Zach Thomas and his student committee members for their dedication to this endeavor and putting in the extra time to make it successful", stated Kevin Cooper, Nevada High School Ag Ed Instructor & FFA advisor. The first annual IHSREC was held on March 25, 2013 with a Planting a Seed grant provided by the DuPont and the Iowa Soybean Association. This year's committee and financial sponsor was the Nevada High School Ag Ed Department and Nevada FFA chapter. Students have already started planning for 2015 by identifying growth opportunities, and what new areas could be added.

At this time, with transportation cost, Gates Hall rental, lunch, and other expenses, the conference cost \$3,348, however some of this cost will be offset by the \$3 per student fee, therefore bringing the total cost under \$3,000. Nevada FFA

members approved a budget of \$4,500 earlier in the year.

Nevada Ag Ed & FFA Open House

In February of 2004, Remington Seed Company of Indiana donated property that included a facility the Nevada High School Agriculture Education & FFA chapter could use for a place to work. It is ten years later, and the educational and economic value of this resource is impressive.

In ten years the Nevada FFA has restored thirty-eight tractors representing a value of \$177,950.00. "It was interesting to go back through the records the other night with a former student and count up what we have done, and that does not include current inventory!" stated Kevin Cooper, Nevada High School Ag Ed instructor and FFA advisor. "Besides tractors, there have been 21 balers, plows, and implement trailer projects too!" added Cooper. Titan Tire has been an extremely generous donor of tires for the tractor projects also.

Besides equipment work, the lab turns into a fruit warehouse for about three weeks in December. "There has been \$186,000 of fruit, cheese and sausage come through in that ten year period also creating \$63,410 of net income" reports Cooper. "These monies go directly to support student leadership development and expanded learning activities for our students", added Cooper.

The students have been very fortunate to have so many people and companies willing to help them and provide these educational resources. Last fall Farm Credit Services of America awarded the Nevada FFA with a \$500 grant to provide an open house and Ag career day for underclassmen. The public was invited to the Nevada High School Ag Mech lab on Thursday, April 17th from 4:30 to 7:30pm to commemorate the donation. In addition, the Alex Partridge MATCO Tool inventory was on display also. Kohler Engine Company donated twenty of the XT series engines for the Ag Mech program at no cost. "Wow, these engines are brand new, right from the factory", stated Cooper.

Iowa High School Music Association State Solo and Ensemble Contest

The Nevada High School Music Department traveled to Greene County High School on Saturday March 29 in Jefferson for the Iowa High School Music Association State Solo and Ensemble Contest. Students prepared individual vocal and instrumental solos and small groups to perform and be evaluated by an adjudicator.

Nevada received a total of seven Gold Division 1 ratings: Lydia Richards- flute solo, Baylee Milam - Baritone saxophone solo, Tanner Jones- snare drum solo, Will Sutton-vocal solo, Woodwind quintet (Lydia Richards, Madeline Mathis oboe, Alexis Houseman clarinet, Madison Merfeld French horn, Katie Gildersleeve baritone saxophone), Vocal duet (Will Sutton, Isaac Royer), Vocal duet (Ashley Thacker, Megan Perkins)

Nevada also received fourteen Silver Division 2 ratings, five Bronze Division 3 ratings and one Division 4 rating.

Spring Jazz Night

On Tuesday March 25, at 7:00 pm in the Tope Auditorium, the Nevada Middle School and High School Jazz Bands were in concert for our Spring Jazz Night. This year was extra special. Nevada alumni Wally Olsan ('48) was active in the band, particularly jazz band. During high school he formed a dance band that performed in Nevada and was active as a trumpet player in the Red Sneaker Jazz Band for years. Wally passed away this past summer. His family graciously donated a memorial to the band to use at our discretion. About that time, the band was also looking for a guest artist to perform. Dr. Bob Washut, University of Northern Iowa, agreed to appear and asked if we would like to have him write a composition for this concert. At this concert, the

premiere performance of this piece was performed by the high school jazz band. This was a great learning opportunity for our students to prepare a piece that had never been heard. Dr. Washut was very complimentary of our jazz bands and announced at the concert the commissioned piece entitled "La Nevada Wade" will be published by a Wisconsin publishing company.

Robert Washut is Professor of Music at the University of Northern Iowa, where he served as Director of Jazz Studies from 1980 - 2002. An accomplished jazz composer and arranger, Washut has received numerous commissions from collegiate and high school jazz ensembles, professional jazz artists, and symphony orchestras. Many of his works are published by Kendor Music (Delevan, NY), UNC Jazz Press (Greeley, CO), Walrus Music Publishing (Pismo Beach, CA), C.L. Barnhouse (Oskaloosa, IA), Heritage JazzWorks (Lorenz Corp - Dayton, OH), Sierra Music Publishing (Liberty Lake, WA) and Winzer Press (Cedar Falls, IA).

During his 22 years as director of the award-winning UNI Jazz Band One, Washut recorded 11 CDs, toured Europe three times, consistently received "Outstanding Band" recognition at collegiate jazz festivals throughout the Midwest, and was awarded three "Outstanding Performance" citations in DownBeat's Annual Student Music Awards.

Washut was inducted into the Iowa IAJE Hall of Fame in 2003, the Des Moines Community Jazz Center Hall of Fame in 2013, and was selected as Outstanding Teacher at UNI in 1996.
