Notes from the Nurse

Current 6th grade parents: The Iowa
Department of Public Health has required an
updated Tdap Immunization for all incoming
7th graders.

This change took place in the 2013-14 school
year and requires all students born on or after
September 15, 2000 to have the booster. This is
done to prevent the spread of whooping
cough. 7th graders

are allowed to play sports at Nevada Middle
School and will need a yearly physical to be on
the team, so over the summer would be a great
time to update your child's immunization record
and get their
sport physical at the same visit.

Current 8th grade parents: All children
newly enrolling in an Iowa High School are
required to have a **dental screening**. This
requirement was passed by the 2007 legislature
and became effective July 1, 2008. The dental
form was included in your child's high school
registration packet. If you need another copy
please let me know or ask at your dentist office.

NHS Music performs in Orlando

The students of the Nevada High School Band and Chorus spent Spring Break taking advantage of the performance opportunities in Orlando Florida and Disney Performing Arts.

The group of 87 students and 11 adults departed Sunday March 13 at 5:00 am and drove 27 hours on two Windstar coach buses to Orlando. Day one transitioned to day two by driving directly to Disney Hollywood Studios. After an afternoon hotel check in, it was back to Hollywood Studios that concluded with the Fantasmic Light Show and a new Star Wars fireworks finale.

Tuesday, the students experienced the Magic Kingdom including a stunning performance by the NHS Band at Disney Springs. Despite near record heat, the music flowed and the audience, which included numerous Nevada travelers, was treated to a 25 minute performance. "Students were poised and professional," according to band director Wade Presley. Tuesday was a 14 hour day, where students witnessed the opening and closing of the Magic Kingdom.

Wednesday was the choir's turn to perform at the Disney Performing Arts Choir Clinic. Students learned how Disney music soundtracks are produced and added to the movies. Two Lion King songs were learned and used as the actual music in an animated Lion King recording. Choir students exclaimed that this was the best choir clinic they had ever had.

Upon returning for the day to EPCOT students enjoyed the World Showcase among numerous highlights. This day ended with a private dinner and viewing party for Illuminations.

A trip to the Atlantic Ocean and Cocoa Beach followed by Disney Springs completed the fourth day. Friday we opened and closed Universal Studios and Islands of Adventure, which includes the Wizzarding World of Harry Potter.

The Nevada Music Department was well received everywhere. Travelers and workers commented on the musicianship, respect and politeness of the group during our trip. Nevada can be proud of the way these students represented our community.



Self-Paced Math at the Middle School

There are many different learning styles in a math classroom. Some students learn material very quickly, and others need to wait for their classmates to catch up before moving on. Some students are easily distracted while the teacher is delivering instruction and miss important content. While others would rather ask a question one-on-one rather than in front of the entire class. Some students become overwhelmed if they miss a day of school or have trouble working on homework if folks at home are not sure how to do the material.

Because of our diverse learners, this year the 5th and 6th grade math teachers embarked on a new adventure in their classrooms. The self-paced and blended learning approach allows us to better meet the needs of ALL students in our classrooms.

Each student at the middle school has a school issued Chromebook. Because of this, we chose to create our curriculum on a website that can be accessed through the NCSD website. All of the instruction is online in video format. This type of instruction allows students to pause or replay instructional videos, so the student is able to focus on the content. It allows students to move on to new curriculum when they have shown proficiency in a standard. Teachers and students are able to interact in smaller groups and have more individualized instruction. It also allows access to the content 24/7, so students and parents can work together at home. There are three main components to math class this year: computation days, task days, and self-paced days. Computation and task days will have students working collaboratively as a whole class or in smaller groups towards strengthening required skills and problem solving techniques. Self-paced days will have students working individually on new content at a rate that is comfortable to them. There is a minimum pace students can work at. Weekly goals are posted for

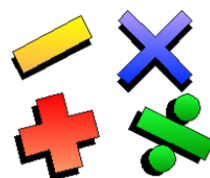
students to monitor their progress. However once the weekly goals have been met, students are able to move on to a new topic or explore the current topic deeper.

To date we have noticed three main successes of or benefits to students in the self-paced program:

1. *Increased student engagement.* We are using a web-based portal that provides access to online learning activities and assessments which give immediate feedback. We are finding students are more persistent in their efforts to move forward in the curriculum, are working together to help achieve the weekly goals, and are engaging more in dialogue with the teacher since there is so much time for one-on-one conversations about student work.

2. *Increased student learning.* This is being demonstrated by increased depth of mastery of mathematics' concepts for many students. In a survey given about students' opinion of Self-paced math some students commented being able to move at their own pace took away pressure to rush through topics and have allowed them to understand topics they never fully grasped in the past. Another benefit students are gaining are the important "soft skills" many employers report as lacking in recent job applicants such as time management, accountability, organization, the ability to problem solve, and persistence.

3. *Increased teachers' professional growth and collaboration.* This has been demonstrated by our mutual efforts with administration to create and maintain the new pedagogy in our classrooms. Being able to work as a "math team" has allowed us to combine our individual strengths and ideas into a program that ensures all students have the same experience in 5th and 6th grade math.
