
CONGRATS TO NEVADA NERDS ANONYMOUS!

NEVADA FFA UPDATE

HORTICULTURE STUDENTS MAKE FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

Chris Clark, owner of the Flower Bed in Nevada, demonstrated basic floral arrangement to Mr.Cooper's horticulture students on Tuesday, January 8th. Students were able to construct their own arrangements and learn how to use assorted plant materials. Clark also explained wholesale cost of products, and overhead cost of owning your own business. After class, students gave their arrangements to faculty and staff as a token of appreciation.



NEVADA FFA FRUIT SALES OF \$28,870

Nevada High School FFA members sold, mixed, and delivered over \$28,870 in fruit, cheese, sausage and snacks sold to community customers. "To reach this level is awesome, big congrats to our students on an outstanding sales accomplishment" stated Kevin Cooper, Nevada FFA advisor. The chapter also purchased bulk fruit and re-packaged into specialized mixed boxes for variety preferences. Customers could choose from thirty-four different fruit packages, twenty-two cheese & meats, and eighteen different candy items. The chapter unloaded the product with the JD 480 heavy-duty all-terrain forklift that Van Wall Equipment donated to the



chapter in the fall of 2013. Top sellers included 1st place Samantha & Alexis Black with \$2,005 in sales, Aubrey Gibson was 2nd place in sales with \$1.363, and 3rd place Ryanne Barker with \$1,350 All students were provided with a lesson in basic product introduction and how to close a sale. The wholesale product invoices totaled \$18,858, therefore providing the FFA chapter with a net profit of \$10,012. Money from this fundraiser will be used to help pay for the annual FFA banquet, career development contest, leadership conferences, scholarships, and FFA jackets. These funds will also help pay for other Nevada FFA chapter sponsored activities.

OPEN ENROLLMENT REMINDER

Parents/Guardians considering the use of the Open Enrollment option to enroll their child/ren in another public school district in the State of Iowa should be aware of the following dates:

March 1, 2019 Last date for regular Open Enrollment requests for the 2019-2020 school year.

 September 1, 2019 Last date for Open Enrollment requests for students entering kindergarten in the Fall of 2019.

Parents/Guardians of Open Enrolled students whose income falls below 160% of the federal poverty guidelines are eligible for transportation assistance. This may be in the form of a cash stipend.

Parents should be aware that the Open Enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility. For further details, contact the Superintendent's Office at 382-2783.

If you have a child, or know of one, who will be four years old by Sept. 15th, 2019, please call the office to get your child signed up for our 4 year Old Preschool Program. We will send out registration material to parents who are on that list. Our preschool slots will fill up fast and is a first come, first serve basis so please do not wait to call! A NOTE FROM THE NURSE

Just a reminder for 9th grade students to hand in your Certificate of Dental Screening. The audit is usually near the end of March so there is still time to get the form submitted. You can also ask your dental provider to fax the form to me here at school if you've seen the dentist within the last school year. The fax number is 382-2935. Please call if you have any questions about this lowa Department of Public Health requirement. My number is 382-2804.

Parents of current 6th graders: Your child will be required to get new immunizations before entering 7th grade. In 2013 the Iowa Department of Public Health required all students entering 7th grade or having a birth date after September 15, 2000 to get an updated Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis). Please contact me with any questions at 382-2804.

Updated immunization requirements for the incoming 7th graders and incoming 12th graders:

For the 2017-18 school year, and all future school years, all students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade and born after September 15, 2004, will need proof of one dose of meningococcal vaccine and one dose of Tdap.

All students entering, advancing or transferring into 12th grade and born after September 15, 1999, will need proof of two doses of meningococcal vaccine. One dose must be after the age of 16.

As a reminder for when to keep your child home from school:

- 1. Vomiting or diarrhea.
- 2. Severe cough and/or uncontrolled cough.
- 3. Unexplained skin rash or eruptions.
- 4. Swelling, redness, thick drainage, discomfort of the eyes.
- 5. Any communicable diseases. If your child is started on an antibiotic, they must be on the antibiotic for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
- 6. Oral temperature of 100 degrees and above. Your child needs to have a temperature of less than 100 degrees for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication before they can return to school.

Proper handwashing is the best way to keep germs at bay and now is a great time to get your annual flu shot!

For Students, Staff, and Families

Please consider getting your annual flu shot. The flu vaccine is the best way to prevent this terrible preventable disease. Flu symptoms can come up quickly: high fever, headache, extreme fatigue, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, and muscle aches. The flu vaccine is available now. Everyone six months and older should get the shot every year.
