

# NEVADA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS GETTING A HEAD START ON COLLEGE

Nevada High School students are seizing increased programming opportunities. The total number of college credits earned by NHS students has more than quadrupled over the past five years. Post-secondary courses can be offered to students at NHS, online, or at the post-secondary institution, depending on the class. The courses are free to students when taken as a part of their high school schedule and the credit applies to both their high school and college transcripts. The school district receives supplemental weighting and regular per pupil state aid to pay for the courses. For 2017-2018 alone, NHS students earned a total of 1,879 college credits, resulting in an estimated savings of \$304,794 to the students and their families.

# **SKIP THE TRIP**

We've partnered with the Iowa Department of Transportation (DOT) to offer Skip the Trip at Nevada Community Schools. This program allows students to take the driver knowledge test required to obtain a driver's instruction permit here at Nevada Community Schools, saving you time by reducing multiple trips to driver's service centers if your student does not pass on his/her first try.

To be eligible to take the remote knowledge test, your student must be age 14 or older and not currently hold an lowa instruction permit. The test will be offered every other Wednesday during Cub Pride time at Nevada Middle School. Arrangements will be made with Amanda Hoffman for high school students to take the test at their convenience.

The knowledge test will be administered by an approved school/agency official, and the test results will be emailed to the student and retained in the lowa DOT's customer records.

The student will still need to go into a driver's license service center with their parent or legal guardian to be issued an instruction permit. Once a student has successfully completed the test, they will receive a test receipt email. Bring a copy of the email to the driver's license service center, along with the other required identity documentation (listed below) the student must have to be issued their instruction permit.

What documents need to be brought to a service center to receive an instruction permit? (Can also be found at <a href="http://www.iowadot.gov">http://www.iowadot.gov</a>):

- Proof of age and identity (U.S. birth certificate, U.S. Passport, or proof of lawful status documentation)
- Proof of lowa residency (Two documents showing the student's address)
- Proof of your social security number (Social Security card)
- Parental consent form, if you are under 18 and your parent is unable to come with you to the service center (not required if parent or legal guardian is present)

### A NOTE FROM THE NURSE

Just a reminder for 9th grade students to hand in your Certificate of Dental Screening. The audit is usually near the end of March so there is still time to get the form submitted. You can also ask your dental provider to fax the form to me here at school if you've seen the dentist within the last school year. The fax number is 382-2935. Please call if you have any questions about this lowa Department of Public Health requirement. My number is 382-2804.

Parents of current 6th graders: Your child will be required to get new immunizations before entering 7th grade. In 2013 the Iowa Department of Public Health required all students entering 7th grade or having a birth date after September 15, 2000 to get an updated Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis). Please contact me with any questions at 382-2804.

Updated immunization requirements for the incoming 7th graders and incoming 12th graders:

For the 2017-18 school year, and all future school years, all students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade and born after September 15, 2004, will need proof of one dose of meningococcal vaccine and one dose of Tdap.

All students entering, advancing or transferring into 12th grade and born after September 15, 1999, will need proof of two doses of meningococcal vaccine. One dose must be after the age of 16.

#### As a reminder for when to keep your child home from school:

- 1. Vomiting or diarrhea.
- 2. Severe cough and/or uncontrolled cough.
- 3. Unexplained skin rash or eruptions.
- 4. Swelling, redness, thick drainage, discomfort of the eyes.
- 5. Any communicable diseases. If your child is started on an antibiotic, they must be on the antibiotic for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
- 6. Oral temperature of 100 degrees and above. Your child needs to have a temperature of less than 100 degrees for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication before they can return to school.

Proper handwashing is the best way to keep germs at bay and now is a great time to get your annual flu shot!

#### For Students, Staff, and Families

Please consider getting your annual flu shot. The flu vaccine is the best way to prevent this terrible preventable disease. Flu symptoms can come up quickly: high fever, headache, extreme fatigue, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, and muscle aches. The flu vaccine is available now. Everyone six months and older should get the shot every year.
