NOTES FROM THE NURSE

Just a reminder for 9th grade students to hand in your Certificate of Dental Screening. The audit is usually near the end of March so there is still time to get the form submitted. You can also ask your dental provider to fax the form to me here at school if you've seen the dentist within the last school year. The fax number is 382-2935. Please call if you have any questions about this lowa Department of Public Health requirement.

Updated immunization requirements for the incoming 7th graders and incoming 12 grades:

All students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade and born after September 15, 2004, will need proof of one dose of meningococcal vaccine and one dose of Tdap.

All students entering, advancing or transferring into 12th grade and born after September 15, 1999, will need proof of two doses of meningococcal vaccine. One dose must be after the age of 16.

As a reminder for when to keep your child home from school:

- 1. Vomiting or diarrhea.
- 2. Severe cough and/or uncontrolled cough.
- 3. Unexplained skin rash or eruptions.
- 4. Swelling, redness, thick drainage, discomfort of the eyes.
- 5. Any communicable diseases. If your child is started on an antibiotic, they must be on the antibiotic for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
- 6. Oral temperature of 100 degrees and above. Your child needs to have a temperature of less than 100 degrees for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication before they can return to school.

Proper handwashing is the best way to keep germs at bay and now is a great time to get your annual flu shot!

For Students, Staff, and Families

Please consider getting your annual flu shot. The flu vaccine is the best way to prevent this terrible preventable disease. Flu symptoms can come up quickly: high fever, headache, extreme fatigue, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, and muscle aches. The flu vaccine is available now. Everyone six months and older should get the shot every year.

FFA RECOGNIZED AT IOWA CHARACTER AWARDS **EVENT**

Nevada High School FFA Chapter was recognized at the annual lowa Character Awards Event held Friday, July 26, at Prairie Meadows Conference Center. The Iowa Character Awards are promoted and developed through the Robert D. & Billie Ray Center at Drake University. The Nevada FFA Chapter was recognized with a Honorable Mention in the category of student organization of character. Thirty-seven Nevada FFA members organized and conducted an animal agriculture field day for over 210 Nevada middle school students. Nevada FFA served over 292 meals at no charge at their Community Winter Dinner and delivered thirty-four meals to elderly residents. In addition, the chapter volunteers



harvested over 400 watermelons for the school lunch. Sweet potatoes were also harvested and utilized in the school lunch program. 
