District's Long Range Reading Goals for K-6 Literacy

- 1. By the year 2021, 80% of students in grades 1st-6th will be at or above benchmark on the FAST Assessments.
- 2. In the winter of 2020, 79% of students in grades 1st-4th grade were at or above benchmark on the FAST assessment. By the winter of 2021, we will increase that percentage to 80%.

- Staff will develop a better understanding of the SEL competencies to create a positive culture and climate at Central Elementary.
- 2. 92% of 1st 4th grade students will meet grade-level expectations or show one year's growth in reading measured by the Fountas and Pinnell guided reading measure.





Nevada High School Goal:


 Implement the use of Executive Function skills in all classes, no matter the learning environment, at NHS in order to improve student mental well-being and achievement.


Fall 2019-20 -- Central Elementary FAST Literacy Data






Winter 2019-20 -- Central Elementary FAST Literacy Data






Fall 2019-2020 -- NMS FAST Literacy Data






