  - -Central Elementary: Literacy PD from Jen Burns Word Work, Guided Reading, PLC's, Classroom Instruction, and Reading footprints purchase (78K) of reading resources digital subscriptions

- -Nevada Middle School: Construction starting March 8th on the MS, MTSS team assessing curriculum for SEL, and Student Council kindness challenge in the community.
- -Nevada High School: Spring activities starting soon Winter activities have concluded; Nevada CSD will now be a Nike school (contract with BSN), Executive Function PD focus on teachers early, now moving towards increase implementation with students (consist language, etc.), NHS 2021-22 Master Schedule will be released before Spring Break, CPR training completed for Seniors, new Band hire (Drew Barker Marching Band emphasis), new Math hire coming, and the Nevada Ethics Bowl Team WON State competing against MN's state championship team in March.
- -Nevada HS Students: NHS Musical "Hello, My Baby" March 5th-7th; eSports Spring Teams: Rocket League and Mario Kart 8, FFA subdistricts 3 teams advanced, FFA banquet and NHS inductions happening in March; 1st season of girls tennis and boys are playing with Marshalltown, and Trap Shooting starting in Spring Nevada Orange Crush (20ish students participating).

  - ➤ Climate/Culture

- > CTE/PLTW gender equality
  - Possible incentives, promotion of the programs at the HS level, and adults' relational capacity with students.
  - Program promotion at the elementary and MS
  - Diversity of the instructors
- Diversity of incoming teachers
  - Promotion of the opportunities Job Fair (ISU, UNI, and Drake)
  - Moving past the barriers (Ames, housing, and opportunities)
  - Focus on positions other than teachers paras, lunch staff, office staff, etc
  - What are other districts looking like/doing to recruit?
  - Unique offerings position-wise -- offer and teacher
- > Continue to monitor:
  - Graduation rates
  - Dropout rates
  - Attendance
  - Student achievement
- Diversity of curriculum
  - Continuing to explore other options than textbooks
- Offer/teach additional World Language programs
  - Search for ways to provide opportunities for students outside of Nevada HS

  - Computer Science requirement/pathway
  - Elementary/MS experience in PLTW
- ➤ Implementation/learning tied to the NCSD Learner Outcomes
- > PSAT/Pre-ACT not during instructional time
- > The continued growth of SBG across the District
