- 1. Call to Order at 6:30 p.m.
- **2. Approval of Agenda** The Board noted additional fundraisers for the consent agenda. Motion by Harter, second by Anderson to approve the agenda as amended. Motion Carried 4-0
- 3. Public Comment none
- **4.1 Board Salutes Nevada Booster Club** The Board presented Nevada Booster Club president Chad Bauman and the Booster Club a "Board Salutes" for their work for the District.
- **4.2 FFA Presentation** Mr. Cooper and members of the FFA reviewed their activities over the past six months. These activities included: receiving a Gold award at sub-District, contributing melons to School lunch, to the Cross Country Team and to the Food Bank, showing livestock, judging livestock and soil, working at the no till field, receiving the Iowa Character Award, serving the free winter dinner, purchasing a camera from money donated by Keith Davis, meeting with citizens of Mexico who discussed the economy at Couser's, recruited 8th grade students for a head start for FFA, created safety posters, presented to the Rotary, created a Homecoming float, served a staff breakfast, and learned ag literacy at Couser's. Mr. Cooper said that 335 students had signed up for ag classes in the 2022-23 school year.
- **4.3 Middle School Renovation Estes Construction** New representative from Estes Construction, Sam Pearce, spoke to the Board and stated he would be working to finish up the Middle School Renovation project. He said he will try to get items completed prior to Spring Break. Spring Break will be for vestibule work. Yet to come is repair work from water damage from a pipeline break.
- **4.4 Student Achievement Data** Dr. Asmus reviewed Winter FAST testing data with information on literacy, early reading, guided reading, and early math programs.
- **4.5 Elementary Math Curriculum** Dr. Asmus said that the Elementary School has had no set math curriculum. He said teachers are pulling from various resources via their Professional Learning Committees following Iowa Core Standards. Some students use self-paced math but some have difficulty navigating the work. The teachers undertook a deep dive into assessment data and did a math curriculum review. Mr. Temple said the Elementary narrowed its focus to math literacy. The Building Level Team did a survey last fall and 70% of the teaching staff wanted a consistent math curriculum. Mr. Asmus did a survey reaching out to other districts for their math curriculum. Two possible curriculums were reviewed.
- **5.1 Career Ready Iowa Plan** Districts are mandated to produce a Career Reading Iowa Plan by March 11. Career ready items are reviewed annually. The implementation and the plan and its goals were reviewed.
